Of the challenges below, choose two per day, in any order. These should be completed in your home-learning scrapbook or uploaded onto Tapestry. You can work independently or with a family member.

One point will be awarded for each complete task. Tasks in bold will be awarded two points. Bonus points will be awarded for creativity, effort and presentation.

If you wish to make up additional tasks of your own, bonus points will again be rewarded.

Ask your grown up to scribe your Helicopter story and use your family to act it out	Watch number blocks episode 'ten green bottles' (on Cbeebies iplayer, series 3) then draw your own bottles on a wall and write about them in your scrapbook	Paint a rainbow by mixing the colours you need and display it in your window	Have a dance party! Choose your favourite music, dress up in your favourite outfit and show us your best dance moves!
See what the animals at Edinburgh Zoo are getting up to www.edinburghzoo.org.uk/webcams/panda-cam/ and write a sentence about what your favourite animal is doing.	Listen to an audio story (audible.co.uk) and draw a picture of your favourite character	Be a seed detective! When you see your seeds begin to grow, draw a picture of them and write down a sentence in your seed diary.	Send a video message to family or friends to let them know that you are thinking of them
Play a board game with your family	Make some sock puppets and put on a show for your family	Help your grown up to make your lunch – take a photograph as proof	Go on a stick hunt and use your sticks to make different shapes. What can you tell us about them?
