Of the challenges below, choose two per day, in any order. These should be completed in your home-learning scrapbook or uploaded onto Tapestry. You can work independently or with a family member.

One point will be awarded for each complete task. Tasks in bold will be awarded two points. Bonus points will be awarded for creativity, effort and presentation.

If you wish to make up additional tasks of your own, bonus points will again be rewarded.

<p>Make your own Nursery rhyme song bag. In Nursery the children enjoy picking songs/rhymes out of a bag to sing. Make your own or print out the song cards to use at singing times.</p>	<p>Can you help make a healthy snack? Can you help make an unhealthy snack for a treat? I wonder if you can guess what makes one healthy, and one unhealthy?</p>	<p>Make an obstacle course around your house. Give your family instructions on how they complete it eg "climb over the chair, crawl under the table, throw a ball in the box"</p>	<p>Play eye spy around the house looking for objects with the initial sound 'd' Make a list or draw pictures of these objects</p>
<p>Play a game with the whole family, it can be a board game or an active game like hide and seek or what's the time Mr Wolf.</p>	<p>Have a family dance party. Choose your favourite music, dress up in your favourite outfit and show us your best dance moves!</p>	<p>Follow a peace out video for some calm time. https://www.youtube.com/results?sp=mAEB&search_query=peace+out</p>	<p>Add a picture of a 'pot of gold' to put under your rainbow on your window.</p>
<p>Make an object numberline to 10.</p> 	<p>Fill a bag with items with different textures. Using a blindfold, have a go at describing the different textures you can feel. Can you have a guess at what the item might be?</p>	<p>Read a rhyming book together, just before you read a rhyming word let your child have a go at saying a rhyming word. Any word that rhymes goes!</p>	<p>Watch 'Numberblocks' series 1 episode 15 "Hide and seek". Use the stem sentence "1 and 4 together makes 5" when combining two groups to make 5.</p>
