Play a board game with your family which involves a dice. If you do not have a board game, try making your own using pen and paper!	Watch jolly phonics video for 'g' and 'o' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Ry706PuiOh4 Play eye spy around the house looking for objects with that initial sound
Put on a show for your family. You could make up a story to tell everyone, sing your favourite songs or perform a dance. A video would be greatly appreciated!	Go on a number hunt either in your house or during your daily exercise. Make a note of all the different numbers you find!	Add a picture of a 'bird' to put <u>above</u> your rainbow on your window display.	During your daily exercise, go on a Spring walk and hunt for signs of Spring. What can you find? Take a picture as evidence. You may want to use the Spring Checklist to help.
Make a salt dough family keepsake. One idea with instructions is from the blog https://www.messylittlemonster.com/2020/04/salt-dough-family-handprint.html	Explore floating and sinking. Can you predict what would float and what would sink?	Draw a picture of yourself and someone else in your house. What makes you different from them?	Practise throwing and catching a ball with someone in your home. Can you count how many times you can pass to each other without dropping the ball?
