<p>Write a list of words that you can think of that rhyme with cat <u>or</u> book.</p>	<p>Write a message for someone in your family to make them smile. You could give them a complement or thank them for something they have done.</p>	<p>Look around your house for 3 things that are taller than you and 3 things that are shorter than you. Can you draw a picture to show what you found?</p>	<p>Play a throwing and catching game with someone else in your house. How many times can you catch the ball/beanbag/ teddy before someone drops it?</p>		
<p>If you have some playdoh, take part in a dough disco! Can you use pegs to hang washing on the line? Can you learn how to fold clothes? Do you know where everything goes to help put the clothes away?</p>	<p>Practise your adding skills – roll 2 dice and work out the total number of dots.</p>
