One point will be awarded for each complete task. Tasks in bold will be awarded two points. Bonus points will be awarded for creativity, effort and presentation.

If you wish to make up additional tasks of your own, bonus points will again be rewarded.

If you are unable to print off the resources on the website to match these activities, then just record the work as best you can in the children’s exercise book.

There are some links to home experiments on the school Facebook page	Write a letter to someone who is having to self-isolate by themselves (real or imaginary). What could you write to cheer them up?	Learn a new skill – knitting, rollerblading, making your parents a cup of tea, making your own lunch, tying your shoelaces.
Do some yoga – have a look at Cosmic Yoga on YouTube – https://www.youtube.com/user/CosmicKidsYoga	Create an obstacle course in your garden. Which one of your family members can run around the quickest?	Create your own boardgame linked to an area of Maths. It could be addition/subtraction/multiplication or division.	Design a medal/certificate for NHS workers. You could then display this in your window.
Write an adventure story and illustrate it.	Make up a dance routine to your favourite song	Design an album cover for your favourite artist. You could either draw it or do it on the computer.	Make a dream catcher. Instructions are in the resource section on the school website.
Make a sculpture out of recycled material.	Read a bedtime story with a member of your family.	Listen to an audio book. The link is on the school’s Facebook page.	Design a new toy. Who is the audience? What is it made from? How does it work?
Learn how to say hello and goodbye in 5 different languages.	Bake something with a family member and then evaluate it. How could you improve it? Then try again.	Design a new room for Willy Wonka’s chocolate factory. What would be in there?	Complete the Rocket Launcher experiment. Instructions are in the resource section on the school website.
Make/paint a and add it to your rainbow in your window.	Learn some basic phrases in British Sign Language.
