**Daily Activities**


- Daily Reading: Please record your child's reading in their reading record as usual.

**Week 5 Challenges**

Of the challenges below, choose two per day, in any order. These should be completed in your home-learning scrapbook or uploaded onto Tapestry. You can work independently or with a family member.

<p>Use the <u>Question cards</u> in the resources section to have some interesting conversations with an adult. Can you explain your reasons clearly and speak in full sentences?</p>	<p>Create a flower to add to your window display.</p> 	<p>Use the <u>Minibeast cards</u> in the resources section to play a listening/ guessing game with an adult. If an adult describes the minibeast, can you use the pictures to work out which one it is? Go on a minibeast hunt – how many of these minibeasts can you find?</p>	
<p>Count how many chairs, doors, cushions, spoons, beds etc. are in your house. Record this by drawing pictures and writing the numbers.</p>	<p>Create your own 'Monster Tunnel' game (see below) and play it with other people at home.</p>	<p>Make yourself a number line from 0-10. Shut your eyes while an adult covers one of the numbers. Can you tell them which number it is? Explain how you knew...</p>	<p>Have a movie night at home – make a poster to advertise it and make tickets for the different people in your house.</p>
 <p>Draw or create a giant picture and put yourself in it! Upload your photo onto Tapestry and perhaps send it to a friend or family member.</p>	<p>Take a wildlife photograph on your daily walk, worthy of a 'Country File' calendar picture.
