Challenges

Of the challenges below, choose two per day, in any order. These should be completed in your home learning scrapbook or uploaded onto Tapestry. You can work independently or with a family member. One point will be awarded for each complete task. Tasks in bold will be awarded two points. Bonus points will be awarded for creativity, effort and presentation.

If you wish to make up additional tasks of your own, bonus points will again be rewarded.

<p>Read the story ‘Superworm-by Julia Donaldson’. If you do not have a copy of the story you can watch it being read aloud at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OkeNDquvZEE</p> <p>What was your favourite part of the story and why? Maybe you could draw a picture in your scrap book.</p>	<p>Play a game of ‘worms and ladders’ (snakes and ladders) with the family.</p> <p>If you do not have your own there is a printable version available.</p>	<p>Turn yourself into a super hero just like super worm!</p> <p>What will your super hero name be? What will you wear? What super powers will you have? Draw a picture in your scrap book to show me.</p>	<p>Painting with worms!</p> <p>Cook some spaghetti until soft. Dip the spaghetti in some paint and have fun making a picture using your worms! Try using different colour paints, what do you notice happening to the colours?</p>
<p>Can you move and replicate the actions of the creatures in the story? For example; Slither like a worm, jump like a frog, zoom like a fly. Can you think of your own movement for different animals? You can use the movement cards to help you.</p>	<p>Learn and perform this Nursery rhyme about a wiggly worm!</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-wiggly-woo/zvj8gwx</p>	<p>Can you find 3 things longer and 3 things shorter than a pencil? How many pencils long is the longest item?</p>	<p>Make your own superworm. It is up to you how you make it.. you may want to thread pasta onto string, make it out of junk modelling or use natural resources!</p>
<p>Learn the superworm chant and add actions to help you remember. Film your chant and upload to tapestry 📹</p> <p>“Super worm is super long, superworm is super strong, Watch him wriggle, see him squirm.</p> <p>Hip Hip hooray for Super worm!”</p>	<p>Using your left over spaghetti and paint, use the pasta to write your name. If you do not have any cooked pasta you can use cut up pieces of string. (it may be helpful to have the name written first)</p>	<p>Superworm does lots of kind things in the story. What can you remember he did? Plan to do something kind for someone in your house today.</p>	<p>Can hear the initial sounds of the minibeasts in the Superworm story? Can you match the sound to the letter? (sheet provided)</p> <p>What other things can you think of which start with the same sounds?</p>
