Can you eat your lunch or dinner using a knife and fork? Can you cut the food yourself? Which food is easier to cut and why?</p>	<p>Explore your garden or the park for minibeast. Where are the minibeast hiding? What is it like where they live? What minibeast can you find?  You can use the minibeast hunt list to help identify them.</p>	<p>This week we would have had our 'Dad's Den Day' to mark Father's Day. Enjoy spending time building a den together at home. Maybe have a tasty snack and a story in it after it has been built. We would love to see any pictures on Tapestry!</p>

Lift up the cup and say the number. Can you say it without counting the dots? How fast can you say the number?</p>	<p><b><u>Rhyming Bingo</u></b> Play a game of rhyming bingo. Cover up a picture if it rhymes with the word called out. Remember to shout <b>BINGO</b> to win!</p> 	<p>Draw a picture of your favourite minibeast.  Can you give your minibeast a name? Do you know what your minibeast eats? Find out and include it in your picture.</p>	<p><b><u>Positional Language</u></b> Look at the worm hiding. Can you tell me where he is hiding using your positional language? Have a go at placing your teddy around your house. Can you describe where he is?</p>
<p>Gather as many shoes as you can. How can you sort the shoes?- by family member, laces and no laces? Children's and adults? However you choose to sort your shoes, can you count how many are in each group? Which group has more, which has fewer? Try to match the amount to a number. Can you sort them a different way?</p>	<p>Practice taking your shoes on and off. Try with different types of shoes-wellies, velcro, buckles ect. Remember to check for banana feet!</p> 	<p>Do you remember our days of the week song we sing during key worker group? Try to sing it with your grown up. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oKqAblcwFOA">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oKqAblcwFOA</a></p>	<p>Set objects or pictures around the room. Say <i>find me something that rhymes with...</i> and say a word that rhymes with an object. They then need to find the item that rhymes. If they are finding it tricky start with fewer items.</p>
