


Daily Activities

If you wish to make up additional tasks of your own, bonus points will again be rewarded.

By Lydia Monks on Tapestry.</p> <p>After the story discuss what you and your child are scared of.</p> 	<p>Sing the Nursery rhyme- The Incy Wincy Spider.</p>  <p>Are you brave enough to sing it on your own for your family?</p>	<p>Spiders trap insects in their sticky web, why do spiders not get stuck as well?</p> <p>Explore how the spider stops itself from sticking doing a simple science experiment.</p>	<p>Explore your garden or the park, try to find spider webs.</p> <p>Can you see any spiders making a web? Have any bugs been caught? Try to not touch the web, the spider has worked hard on them!</p> 																								
<p>Draw a picture of your house and the people who live in your house with you.</p> <p>Attempt to hear the sounds in their names. Can you have a go at writing their name next to their picture?</p> 	<p>Watch Numberblocks season 2- eight</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08pgvmb/numberblocks-series-2-eight</p> <p>Go on a number hunt and look for the number 8. How many can you find?</p>	<p>Lets talk about number 8.</p>  <p>Using the question prompts discuss what your child can see in the picture to do with the number 8.</p>	<p>Watch 'Come Outside's' episode about spiders</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=UQ2RzDI0vM</p> <p>Draw a spider in your journal. Remember to add 8 legs.</p> <p>What facts about spiders can you remember? Get your grown up to write these next to your picture.</p>																								
<p>Take time to lie down outside and watch the clouds. What noises can you hear? Are some noises louder? Can you hear any really quiet noises? Can you see any shapes in the clouds?</p> 	<p>Practise your rhyming. Listen to a story which rhymes, can you spot the rhyming words?</p> <p>Rhyming Words</p> <p>Draw a line to join the rhyming words together.
