## Parents' evening

Due to proposed strike action by the NEU on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March, we have taken the decision to move our parents' evenings to the following week. You should still receive your child's mid-year reports on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> March.

## **NEU Industrial Action- Strike Action**

There is another planned day of industrial action planned for Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February 2023. As was the case with the last strike, I am still unable to confirm how many teachers are intending to strike and the year groups/classes that this will affect. As a reminder, staff are under no obligation to inform me in advance of their intention to strike.

As I am unaware of the numbers of teachers that I will currently have available, I am unable to safely plan for the children to attend school. As such, I am asking all parents and carers to plan for the school to be closed to all on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February. Please make any necessary childcare arrangements in preparation.

However, on the day, we may be in the position to open specific classes/year groups if any teachers report for work. I can then decide on how we can open the school to the greatest number of pupils. School will send text messages to each class who are able to attend and we will aim to do this at the earliest opportunity in the morning. We will also update our website with a list of the classes able to attend as these are confirmed.

If you do not receive a text message, please assume that your child's class remains closed. Our webpage <a href="https://www.oultonprimary.co.uk/schoolclosure/">https://www.oultonprimary.co.uk/schoolclosure/</a> will be updated each day to reflect the classes that we expect to be open. If your class is expected to be open, please continue to have childcare arrangements in place as this is only an indication.

## **POPS Disco- Appropriate Parent Contact**

To organise any school event, whether it be on-site or off-site, takes a great deal of careful planning to ensure that it runs smoothly and, most importantly, safely.

Our school discos are organised by members of POPS who give up their free time to provide this opportunity for the children. They are supported by members of staff who also give up their free time to attend. Deadlines for submitting permission slips and making payments are put in place to allow enough time for POPS and the school office to collate



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pupil information, check that supervision levels are safe, put arrangements in place to support specific pupils, purchase refreshments and ensure that any allergy/ dietary needs are met. These are processes that take time and care to ensure that they are done properly and that all children are safe.

Sadly, leading up to the recent disco, office staff and POPS members have been faced with verbal abuse, threatening behaviour and unacceptable comments from some of our school community because children have not been able to attend due to their parent/carer missing the deadline. Deadlines are clearly stated on all disco correspondence and, when these are nearing, reminders are texted to families and posted on the POPS Facebook page.

As a school, we are incredibly grateful for the time and hard work that POPS put into organising events for our children. The money they raise subsidises school trips, buys additional resources and provides experiences for children that they might not otherwise have access to.

All members of the school community have the right to work or be in school without fear of aggression or abuse. The school has a 'Dealing with Abusive Behaviour' policy which will be followed if there are further instances of this type of behaviour by individuals- this could result in restrictions on how you can contact the school and may ultimately result in you not being able to access the school site. We want to work constructively with parents and carers and hope that this is not a course of action we need to take. **Mr Horton and**
