On Wednesday 7th February, Daisy and Lucy from Year 6 and Nellie-Jean from Year 5, proudly represented Pupil Voice at the Outer South Community Youth Summit at Morley Town Hall. Friday Super Sing

In previous years, we used to do a weekly 'Music Workshop' where children learnt singing skills and a variety of songs; some requiring quite complex skills. To enrich our school offer, we have decided to bring these lessons back in the form of 'Friday Super Sing'. During the last half term, Miss Brown has taken the EYFS and KS1 children each Friday and taught them a range of singing skills using engaging songs; the children performed 'The Lion Sleeps Tonight' in assembly today. It was such an impressive performance and fantastic to see our youngest children singing together and in different parts throughout the song!

After half term, Miss Brown will take children in KS2 for a weekly Super Sing and they will be working on songs to perform during their Easter celebration. The phases will continue to swap each half term between EYFS/KS1 and KS2.

A huge thank you to POPS for organising the school disco this week. Both the EYFS/KS1 and KS2 Discos were well attended; the children looked to be having a fantastic time. Thank you also to the staff who stayed to support these events.

School Trips

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We have a few upcoming trips and visits during the next half term. Y4 will be heading to Whitby at the end of the month. This is the first time we have taken the children to Whitby on residential and they have a packed itinerary including a town trail, jet polishing, boat trip, a beach visit, a storyteller and making Viking swords/shields. Hopefully, the weather will be kind to them and I am sure that they will have a fantastic time. The Y3/4 children

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who are staying at school will have an outside visitor to come and do Viking themed activities with them whilst the residential is happening.
